Creditors to Put NBCC, Suraksha's Jaypee Infra Bids to Vote from Monday

New Delhi | Mumbai: Jaypee Infrastructure's creditors have accepted the resolution plans of NBCC and the Suraksha Group for the bankrupt developer and decided to put both offers to vote next week to select the winner, people with direct knowledge of the matter said.

The voting will start on June 14, the committee of creditors (CoC) decided at a meeting on Thursday. The CoC members comprising lenders and homebuyers in Jaypee Infra's stuck projects will have time till June 23 to vote for their choice of the bidder.

Both Suraksha and NBCC are likely to hold virtual meetings with homebuyers to explain the details of their plans before the beginning of the voting.

In December 2019, the CoC had selected NBCC's bid to acquire the debt-stressed company with 97.36% of the votes in favour of the offer. The other contender was Suraksha Realty in March 2020, the National Company Law Tribunal approved NBCC's proposal with modifications, but the state-run company moved the appellate court against the modification to its plan.

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The Supreme Court took charge of the matter from the National Company Law Appellate Tribunal on suo moto in the interest of homebuyers. It rejected NBCC's plan as non-compliant on March 24, 2021, with a direction to Jaypee Infra to file a fresh bid from both parties and conclude the process within 45 days.

In its revised plan submitted this week, the Suraksha Group has offered to deposit ₹300 crore immediately if Jaypee Infra's creditors approved its bid, so that construction work of the bankrupt developer's stuck projects can resume without waiting for the court's clearance. This proposal to deposit the money is in addition to its earlier offer.

NBCC has offered 1,100 acres of additional land valued at over ₹2,200 crore to dissenting creditors.

HOARDING RAW MATERIALS AND DRIVING UP PRICES

Chinese Solar Gear Vendor Alleges Cartelisation by Peers

Aiko Solar's report vindicates our stand of supplier cartels, say Indian solar power developers

Mumbai: A leading Chinese solar panel components manufacturer has accused fellow Chinese companies of colluding to restrict supply and artificially increase prices of solar components amid the ongoing commodity super cycle.

The alleged cartelisation has a direct bearing on Indian solar power generating companies, as they overwhelmingly rely on Chinese imports.

Aiko Solar, one of the largest merchant solar cell makers in the world, made the allegations in a recent report on "PV industry hotspots". It claimed that some raw material companies were hoarding and driving up prices. "ET took the help of language experts to get the report translated from Mandarin."

"The coordinated behaviour of some companies to drive up prices and substantially increase prices not only affects the achievement of the mid-year photovoltaic installation target and the solemn promise of carbon peak and carbon neutrality" made by Chinese President Xi Jinping to the world, it said.

"In fact, some companies can create the illusion that there is a serious shortage of silicon wafers, boosting intermediate traders, hoarding in all links of the industry chain, and driving up prices," it added.

The report does not name any companies directly.

Industry players, however, believe three companies — Jinko, Longi Solar, and Trina Solar, which cumulatively supply more than 75% of the raw materials to Indian renewable energy developers — have been targeted.

Indian developers and manufacturers - who for long have been complaining either about Chinese

vendors reneging on signed contracts or "dumping" products below cost price - said the report vindicates their stand.

"Indian solar power developers have been pointing to price escalation after signing of firm contract and cartelisation by Chinese module manufacturers for quite some time now," a spokesperson for Solar Power Developers' Association (SPDA) said.

Tax practitioners advising people who have been served notices find this strange. "The department can always argue that if the assessee has nothing to hide whether the assessment order is issued by the investigation wing or the central circle. But there can be a conflict of interest as the person entrusted with investigation is also passing the assessment order," said a senior chartered accountant.

The investigation wing collects intelligence and carries out enquiries and searches to spot tax evasion and undisclosed wealth. Collating the evidence gathered by the investigation wing, the central circles prepare the assessment order. "Investigation officers are often best placed to issue the assessment order, particularly in black money matters which involve extensive probe... People don't furnish evidence, don't cooperate, and try to delay the process. The assessing officer may not be fully clued on to the case and has to go over the investigation report again. Some assesses take advantage of this to stall the process," said the tax official.

The CBDT spokesperson did not comment on the subject. Industry circles think that the wider involvement of the investigation wing would be confined to Black Money cases due to the nature of the statute. The Black Money (Undisclosed Foreign Income and Assets) and Imposition of Tax Act, which was passed in mid-2015 and came into force on April 1, 2016, was brought in to overcome the limitations in the Income Tax Act and tax hidden wealth of Indians stashed in tax havens and held as properties and others assets through individual names, closely-held companies, discretionary trusts and foundations. In the first set of assessments which became time-barred on March 31, 2021, some of the assessments have been done by the investigation wing. This is likely to continue in subsequent cases. For instance, in an order in May 2021 (relating to two assesses), the deputy director and assistant director investigation have been assigned to exercise the power and perform the function of the assessing officer.

The Association of Healthcare Providers (India) AHPI said that if the government order does not say anything about the charges that the hospitals can take for offsite vaccinations, it will come out with a policy regarding the hospitals under its umbrella. "If the hospitals don't get any clarity, we on our part will fix charges for offsite vaccinations by June 21. Till then the hospitals can charge what they have been charging," said Girdhar Gyan, director general, AHPI.

Hospitals also feel that Rs 150 cap will result in vaccination numbers going down as this will demotivate private healthcare providers from setting up jumbo centers or large camps to vaccinate people in large numbers. "The consumption will fall, if the Rs 150 cap is what the government decides also for offsite vaccinations. We expect some relaxation from the state government," said an executive.
